

# CityKids Summer Activities

## June 2010

- **6/7 Centennial Olympic Park:** meet at CityChurch-Eastside parking lot at 10:30am to carpool, or at the playground at 11. Bring a picnic lunch, and swimsuits for the kids to enjoy the Fountain of Rings.
- **6/10 Yellow River Game Ranch:** 4525 Highway 78, Lilburn, GA 30047. Meet at the entrance building at 10am. Cost is \$8 for ages 12 and up; \$7 for ages 2-11; under 2 is admitted free with a paying adult.
- **6/15 Stone Mountain:** One Day Adventure Passes can be purchased at Kroger for a discount price of \$24.60 adult/\$18.20 children. The pass includes unlimited admission to the Scenic Railroad, Summit Skyride, Sky Hike, 4D Theater, Camp Highland Outpost (the ropes course), mini-golf, the Plantation and Farmyard, and the Great Barn. As a group, we can also decide to hike to the top of the mountain, hike the nature trails, and/or spend time at the playground. Additionally, a One Day Parking Pass (i.e. admission into the park) must be purchased for \$10 for each vehicle. Meet at the Main Ticket Plaza at the entrance to Crossroads at 10am.
- **6/18 Suburban Lanes Bowling:** 2619 North Decatur Road, Decatur GA, 30033. Meet inside the bowling alley at 10:30am.
- **6/21-6/25 Vacation Bible School at Intown Community Church:** 9am-12pm. Register online at [intown.org](http://intown.org)
- **6/28 All American Skating Center:** 5400 Bermuda Road, Stone Mountain, GA 30087. The morning skating session is 10am-1pm. \$6 to skate; \$2 skate rental. Meet at the rink.
- **6/30 Blueberry Picking:** farm to be determined. We will most likely depart from CityChurch-Eastside parking lot at 9am.

## July 2010

- **7/6 Roswell Cultural Arts Center Summer Puppet Series:** 950 Forest Street, Roswell, GA 30075. The show, *The Giant, The*

*Beanstalk, and Jack*, begins at 10am. \$5 adults/ \$4 children 2 and up. Puppet making workshop immediately following the show for children 5 and up, for an additional \$3. **Cash or Check Only**. Meet at the ticket booth at 9:30am.

- 7/8 **Sweetwater State Park**: We will do some kid-paced hiking on trails that follow Sweetwater Creek. Pack a picnic lunch, as well as water shoes and a change of clothes for the kids who will likely want to stomp around in the water. Meet at CityChurch-Eastside parking lot at 9:45am for a caravan out to the park.
- 7/12 **Dixieland Fun Park**: 1675 Highway 85 N, Fayetteville, GA 30214. \$19 Fun Pass for adults, or \$10 for adults to enter the park only and play mini-golf ; \$15 for children 36”-43” ; \$10 for children 31”-35” . Meet at the ticket booth at 11am.
- 7/15 **Piedmont Park Pool**: \$4 adults/\$2 children. This pool has beach entry, a current channel for floating, lap lanes, and concessions. Meet at the pool at 11am.
- 7/20 **Storytime at Little Shop of Stories**: 133A East Court Square, Decatur, GA 30030. Storytime begins at 11am. Meet at the store by 10:45. Stay for lunch afterward at Zucca Pizzeria.
- 7/23 **Cochran Mill Nature Center**: 6300 Cochran Mill Rd., Palmetto, GA 30265. \$3 adults/\$2 children. **Cash or Check Only**. Features of this center include a Birds of Prey Compound, reptile exhibits, Egyptian Fruit Bats, fish pond, bog garden, trails, and waterfalls. Meet in front of the center’s log cabin building at 10am.
- 7/26 **Sidney Marcus Playground**: Cumberland Road at Cumberland Circle in Morningside. Meet at the park at 10 am.
- 7/28 **Piedmont Park**: biking and playground. Bring your child’s bike and your walking shoes, and the children can ride all over the park on paved pathways. Then we can enjoy playground time and a picnic. Meet at CityChurch-Eastside parking lot at 9:30am for a caravan to the park.
